God's Delight

Passage: Micah 7:7–20

---

1. In light of studying God's covenant-loyal love, we see that God keeps His promises in a loving, kind, and merciful way. What does it look like for God to delight in lovingkindness? Try to focus on the tangible evidences of God delighting in lovingkindness. What can we see and experience when considering His lovingkindness? Consider passages like **Isaiah 16:5; 55:3** and **Psalms 51:1; 57:3**.
  
2. The use of the word “lovingkindness” is exclusive to the Old Testament with the exception of one New Testament quote (**Acts 13:34**). What exactly are we (church age saints) to learn from considering God's lovingkindness in the Old Testament? Consider **Psalms 136** and see the repeated focus of God's character toward His people.
  
3. God's lovingkindness is said to be abundant and unending many times throughout Scripture. Micah looks to the future and knows there is restoration coming, and waits. How do we patiently wait for our Lord to come when we are overwhelmed with the evil of the world? God is good to His promises, but how do you navigate waiting for God to do what He says He will do? Consider the examples of Abraham in **Hebrews 6:13–15**, and David in **Psalms 37:5–7**.
